

## **INSURANCE CRISIS UPDATE**

This month, another insurance company, State Farm, announced that it would discontinue coverage for certain residents in California - a decision that has directly impacted our community in the North Bay. I have received many calls about the insurance crisis and have been asked by many of you to provide an update on the current situation. While the Department of Insurance is still in the process of adopting new regulations like catastrophic modeling, which are aimed at stabilizing and reducing rates in the state, we are being proactive on this issue and cannot delay.

### **Legislation**

My colleagues and I are pushing back on the insurance industry and authoring bills that are consumer-focused, despite fierce pushback from insurance companies. I wanted to highlight my bill, <u>Assembly Bill (AB) 2416</u>, which strengthens the Safer from Wildfires program. AB 2416 will provide homeowners and communities with cost-effective wildfire prevention efforts and incentivize both property-wide and community-wide wildfire mitigation efforts. This bill also pushes insurers to provide coverage for homes and businesses by requiring the Department of Insurance to periodically review and update the Safer from Wildfire regulations. AB 2416 passed out of the Assembly Insurance Committee on April 18, despite concerted opposition from insurance industry lobbyists.

Another bill I wanted to mention is <u>Senate Bill (SB) 1060</u> authored by my colleague from the Bay Area, Senator Josh Becker. This bill would force insurance companies to consider the billions of dollars the state has spent on wildfire mitigation and the work homeowners have done to protect their homes from wildfires such as creating defensible space around their property. I am supporting this legislation and look forward to voting for it in the Assembly.

I was proud to join eight of my colleagues in presenting a <u>Title IX legislative package</u> and a call to action to ensure that California's higher education institutions are adequately addressing sex discrimination and sexual harassment. Included in this legislative package is my bill <u>AB 1790</u>, which will require the California State University system to strengthen protections against sexual harassment and update their policies on sexual harassment complaints and allegations. By passing this critical legislative package, we can fight sex discrimination and sexual harassment in California higher education. AB 1790 passed through the Assembly Higher Education Committee with bipartisan support!

It was an honor to receive the Assembly Legislative Champion Award from the California Association of Local Conservation Corps. Thank you to the California Local Corps members and staff for all of your work in carrying out vital conservation projects and making a positive impact on the environment and our communities. I am proud to have fought against proposed budget cuts to ensure that our local conservation corps have the resources they need to protect our community's natural resources. Let us continue our journey toward a more sustainable and equitable future for all.





# **ACA 16 PRESS CONFERENCE**

On April 9 I stood with my colleagues & advocates including the Sunrise Movement in support of <u>ACA 16</u> to reaffirm that all Californians deserve clean air, clean water, and a healthy environment. These basic necessities are critical to public health and wellness, they are what Californians deserve, and they are not negotiable. I will continue to fight to ensure that California remains a healthy place to live for generations to come.
